



Dear Student,

Congratulations for securing a conditional place on one of our Agriculture courses at BCA. We look forward to welcoming you to our department and supporting you to gain the skills needed to be successful within an exciting and rewarding industry. Please find below some key information that we hope you will find beneficial to have before starting your course and which clearly outlines our expectations of what you need to prepare for the start of the academic year in order to help you to achieve your full potential.

Compulsory equipment - Agriculture

In September all students are required to bring in:

- Headphones that can be plugged into a computer- these do not need to be expensive. Amazon sell them for: £4.99
- Pens/pencils/notebook / A4 lever arch folder.
- Overalls, BCA polo shirt, safety boots / wellingtons.

Compulsory Uniform and PPE requirements - where and how to order

For all practical sessions the following items must be worn:

BCA T Shirt/poloshirt/top

BCA Coat

Plain black trousers (jeans, cargo trousers, leggings)

Overalls, waterproofs or bib and brace can be worn as required but must be plain dark colours.

Sturdy boots/wellingtons are compulsory for all practical sessions. These will need to be brought with you on the first day of your course and should be stored in your locker.

Machinery Practicals - steel toe cap boots and overalls.

You will be issued with a college ID card and lanyard at enrolment that you are expected to wear at all times outside of practical sessions. If you lose your ID there will be a £5-00 charge to replace

Health & Safety information

No hoodies up, caps or hats are allowed in classrooms during theory sessions. All jewellery and piercings need to be removed for practical sessions.



Tetanus - Working in Agriculture involves working with animals, livestock and soils which increases the risk of contracting tetanus. It is strongly recommended that you are immunised against tetanus. If you have participated in the NHS childhood vaccination programme you would normally have had a final Tetanus vaccination between the ages of 13 and 16 and would have received a certificate confirming the immunisation. **Students will not be allowed to participate in practical work unless they have completed and given the team a slip confirming that they have been immunised.**

Industry Placement

As part of the Agriculture study program students are required to carry out industry placement. This can be completed within any area of the agricultural industry. It is helpful if you can find your own industry placement near home, but BCA will support you with this if it proves to be difficult. All employers accepting industry placement students will be visited by the work placement team to ensure that they comply with health and safety regulations and have public liability and employers liability insurance.

Industry Placement is a mandatory element of your study programme. All agriculture students must undertake industry placement in order to complete their qualification - the dates will be given to you at enrolment.

Student expectations (Code of Conduct)

Within Agriculture we expect our students to conduct themselves in a manner that respects others, livestock and the environment. There is also a collegewide 'Student code of conduct' and during the first week of term we will go through this to ensure that all students are aware of the expectations that we have of them whilst they are on college premises or whilst representing the college offsite. This will include timekeeping and readiness to engage in learning. Food and drink (except water) are not allowed in the learning centre, classrooms and workshop areas.

Lockers

Lockers are available at the college farm yard please bring your own coded padlock on your first day and we will allocate you a locker.

Any additional information

Mobile Phones and Electronic Devices - The use of mobile phones and electronic devices during practical and theory lessons are restricted to 'directed use' by the staff member taking the session. We advise that students turn phones off and store them securely out of sight during practical and theory lessons to avoid any temptation to use them. Where this rule is being



ignored we may insist that the device is left securely in the staff office at the beginning of the day and collected at the end of the day.

Trips and Visits - Any trips that are undertaken throughout the year will be charged separately and the cost will depend on the trip. Sometimes additional qualifications that are not part of the course may be offered and there may be charges associated with these courses.
