

# STATUTORY NOTICE

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** by the Corporation of Berkshire College of Agriculture, in accordance with the Further Education Corporations (Publication of Proposals) (England) Regulations 2012 (SI 2012/1157), of the proposal for the transfer of the property, rights and liabilities to The Windsor Forest Colleges Group and subsequent dissolution of the Further Education Corporation of Berkshire College of Agriculture, Hall Place, Burchetts Green, Maidenhead, Berkshire, SL6 6QR.

Dissolution of the Corporation of Berkshire College of Agriculture is proposed in order that it may merge with The Windsor Forest Colleges Group.

Berkshire College of Agriculture (BCA) is a college of general further education and a recognised land-based college. It currently serves 1536 fulltime, 217 part-time students and 221 apprentices which equates to 1974 students in 2021/22.

All students at Berkshire College of Agriculture and The Windsor Forest Colleges Group who have not yet completed their course of study by the date of the proposed dissolution, will continue to do so at their current locations.

All students applying to Berkshire College of Agriculture or any of the colleges in The Windsor Forest Colleges Group for September 2022, will continue to be enrolled at the college of their choice.

The date proposed for the dissolution of the Corporation of Berkshire College of Agriculture is 1 August 2022.
