# Application information

ALFIE courses are part time for 35 weeks starting on Monday 5th September 2022 to Friday 30th June 2023.

They are intended for adults with mild to moderate learning difficulties who have not already achieved a full Level 2 qualification.

Students may bring a carer or support worker with them if required.

Students may enrol on one or two courses at BCA or Langley college.

People wishing to enrol on the cooking courses must disclose any dietary needs at enrolment .

There are no material costs, however students in the 'Accessing your Community' course will be required to bring money for refreshments and sometimes for activities such as bowling.

The courses are fully funded to adults 19+ who are claiming benefits and their earned income (not including benefits) is less than £338 a month

Students are Carers coming on the Animal Welfare course will need full overalls and wellingtons, and proof of tetanus immunisation within the last 3 years.

**Students are expected to complete their course. Students who are absent for three consecutive weeks may be withdrawn.**

**Students are expected to engage in all lessons and not cause distraction or upset to others.**
